Local Law No.1 of the year 2004

Establishing Residency Requirements for the Appointed Office of Building Inspector

A local law to establish the residency requirements for the appointed of office of for the Town of Hunter

Be it enacted by the town board of the Town of Hunter a follows:

Section 1. Title.

A local law to establish the residency requirements for the appointed office of Building Inspector.

Section II. Authority:

This local law is adopted pursuant to Municipal Home Rule Law 10 (1)(ii) (a) (1) that grants to local governments the authority to enact local laws regarding the qualifications of local officers. Furthermore, this local law recognizes that the State Legislature amended Public Officer Law 63 adding a new subdivision (24) expanding the residency requirements for any appointed public office in the Town of Greenburgh Westchester County, thereby rendering Public Officers Law a special law with respect to any appointed town officer (See of N.Y. Op. Atty. Gen. (Inf.) No. 91-37).

Section III. Super session:

This local law shall supersede Town law, 623(1) in its application to the office of Building Inspector for the Town of Hunter.

Section IV. Residency requirements for the position of the Building Inspector for the Town of Hunter:

The person holding the office of Bldg. Inspector in the Town of Hunter need not be a resident nor, an elector of the Town of Hunter provided however, that such person shall reside in the county in which such town is located or an adjoining county within the State of New York.

Section V. *Inconsistency:*

All other local laws and ordinances- of the Town of that are inconsistent with the provisions of this local law are hereby repealed; provided however, that such repeal shall only b to the extent of such inconsistency and in all other respect law shall be in addition t such other local laws or ordinances regulating and governing the subject matter covered by this local law.

Section VI. Savings Clause:

If any clause, sentence, paragraph, word, section or part of this local law shall be adjudged by any court of competent jurisdiction to be unconstitutional illegal or invalid, such judgment shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remainder, thereof, but shall be confined in its operation of the clause, sentence, paragraph, worked section or part thereof directly involved n the controversy in which such judgment shall have been rendered.

Section VII. Effective Date:

This local law shall take effect filing of the office of the Secretary of State.
