I would like the below statement to be read this evenings at the Town Board meeting during the privilege of the floor.

On <u>July 24, 2018</u> the DOT sent Haines Falls Auto (HFA) a letter (attached) reviewing the plans submitted by HFA. Comments in that letter addressed some HFA site conditions that did not "meet NYSDOT standards". There is no reason why some of the substandard issues could not have been addressed immediately by HFA. On <u>July 9, 2020</u> the DOT issued HFA a Highway Work Permit "Project process improving 4 existing entrances to existing commercial facility...". That Highway Work Permit expired on <u>September 30, 2020</u> and the work is far from complete.

Once again HFA has failed to meet a deadline, and the HFA site looks worse than ever. Is there ever going to be a consequence for HFA's not meeting a deadline or commitment? This process started eight years ago when HFA started work on an unapproved road to the southside junkyard.

We have reviewed the plan set that we received and offer the following comments:

- Please provide detailed access driveway details, showing all dimensions. See attached sheets.
- Please show ADA compliance details for sidewalk ramps. Sidewalks crossing driveways must be 6" thick.
- Site distance measurements for each drive should refer to the required measurements from the AASHTO tables. What's the mitigation for the Route 23A traffic based on these measurements?
- What will be the water situations to Route 23A when the curbed driveway channels
  water to Route 23A from the proposed driveways? Please provide profiles for the
  driveways. We would need to know if waters from these drives will shed across Route
  23A.
- South side driveway doesn't meet NYSDOT standards. The opening is too wide and needs to be closed off more to prevent free flow of traffic in and out of the site.
- Curbing on side drive needs to be wrapped around to the edge of Sunset Park Road.
- Need to provide WZTC notes/details based on the Department standards'.
- Please include the following notes on the work zone traffic control sheets:

Christine Arleo states that she agrees with the letter from James Nihan. She adds that she sent an email to the Town Board with a video attachment which she states shows a vehicle from Haines Falls Auto backing up from the North side to the South Side. She states that the Planning Board had informed her that Haines Falls Auto has been extended till the end of October and she has noticed that cars have disappeared. She feels that this means they were right, and they were junk cars all along. She adds that she has witnessed cars parked on the scales, junk cars where they should not be and a millings pile on the North and South side of the post office. She asks the Town Board what the consequences are when Haines Falls Auto violates their Site Plan and would like this in writing. She adds that with all the traffic parked along Rte. 23A on both sides of the road between Sunset Park Road and the top of the mountain it was treacherous to turn out of Sunset Park Road.

Margaret Nihan states that she agrees with what C. Arleo stated. She adds that she sent an email to Supervisor Legg about the parking on Rte. 23A this past weekend. (Note – email had not yet been received by the Supervisor)

She adds that the Dead-End road sign on Sunset Park Road is bad placement, feels there should be one at the entrance to the road.

J. Farrell states that he will investigate putting up a new sign.

Supervisor Legg asks Margaret Nihan and Christine Arleo to write letters asking for No Parking signs from Sunset Park Road to Rte. 23A so that he can address the situation.

James Nihan states that once again Haines Falls Auto has missed a deadline and asks if there will be any consequences, adding that this all started eight years ago.

Supervisor Legg states that everything must be completed by 10/31/20.
